Matters Arising:

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – 2022

This year we have seen yet further changes from SNZ and I might add, all for the better. All good things going forward for the game of Squash and the direction it is being driven. A few things to take note within the Otago district this year are mentioned below, mostly good but also some challenges to overcome in 2023.

Many thanks again to our sponsors of the interclub competitions as well as the Otago Community Trust, Bendigo Valley Sports and Charity Foundation and the Lions Foundation. Their continued support are invaluable to the affordability of participation, not to mentioned funding behind the scenes work.

The closure of the University Squash courts will be seen as a real low point in the district. Ongoing discussions with Tennis Otago regarding the use of the Logan Park facility will provide a bit of hope to retain the identity of the student club but, in the short term, they will play out of Otago Squash Club in 2023.

Apart from the above, I can point out some good areas this year as well. The Cromwell Community Squash Club have rewritten the book on juniors and how to grow a club. The club's club champs entry list was just short of 100 players which is unbelievable, giving the fact that it is a country club. 150 Members in Cromwell are an outstanding number of members, and this could be seen in their yearend awards ceremony which was attended by several players and a night to remember I might add. The junior program has grown from strength to strength, and this is promising for up-and-coming players and future participation in the junior team competitions representing the district. Wanaka Squash Club also performed well in the junior area and represented a few good players in the junior series.

Another mention should be made of Pirates Squash Club which have now won the Dunedin area interclub club of the year award for a record 4th time in a row. The club came a long way in the last 4 years from the brink of total collapse to a completely revamped state of the art facility. The club also led the numbers area in the district at 180 members were reached in October and growing. The club's junior program is also growing and hopefully can get back to the former glory days from about 5 years ago.

The Alexander Squash Club hosted the E-grade National Super Champs event and again, was a tremendous effort and success. Central Otago remains a destination for everyone, and this was again proved by this wonderful country hospitality representing the district.

For the 2023 season, the Otago District Open will be hosted in Cromwell and going forward, to rotate between Dunedin and Central Otago, something to look forward to and enjoy playing at different venues for this event. Also take note of Wanaka Squash club planning to add another court, great for Central Otago.

Last but not the least, it remains and always will be very difficult to mention all the volunteers from all the clubs in the district. The fact that the sport just like most other minority sports, require quite a lot of volunteer time just to keep things ticking over are a small miracle, so from the Squash Otago Board, many thanks to all the countless hours of our volunteers. Without volunteers and the thankless jobs, they do, squash in the district will struggle to say the very least and remains a passion for everyone involved trying to give back to the community.

Executive Officer's Report 2022



The 2022 year started with much the same negativity as in 2021 with COVID cancelling the first tournament of the year – the 2022 Otago Community Trust NZ Master's Games. This is the 1st time this has happened since its inception in 1992. A difficult decision made by organizers especially with the many months of preparation involved and the financial lost and benefits to the city.

Thankfully, it wasn't too long before the country came to terms with having to live with the virus and most things started to get back to some sort of normality. In saying this, it has been notable that nearly two years of uncertainty has taken its toll on people overall even though in the squash scene, figures out today show Squash Otago's player numbers are up 10% on 2021.

After a couple of years of cancelled events, it was pleasing to see most SNZ calendared events proceeded without too much disruption. Highlights for Squash Otago in 2022 was the hosting of the South Island Quadrangular in May between Canterbury, Midlands, Otago & Southland with Midlands taking home the trophy from Canterbury in second place.

A number of our juniors competed in the South Island Junior Age Groups in Oamaru in July with Aria Bannister and Ashton Hansen successfully taking out the South Island under 15 titles. Levi Casey (Cromwell), a junior on his way up and aged nine at the time, contested the Under 11 title coming a very creditable 2nd behind Zavier Hansen from Gore.

Another event back on the calendar was the school's squash tournament staged during school's sports week with record numbers and schools entered. Otago Boy's High School won the boys event with the girls going to Cromwell Girl's 'A'. Over 50 players from 9 schools throughout the district enjoyed a full day of squash and fun with the 2023 tournament planned to be played over two days to cater for the increased interest. The school development programmes facilitated in the past by Ange Button which disappeared due to the uncertainty of COVID will be back on board and expanded early in 2023.

Another resurgence, after many years in the wilderness, was an Otago Junior National Girls' team. The team made up of Diana Galloway (Wellington import); Martha Toghill (Otago University); Aria Bannister (Otago); Grace Brenssell (Cromwell); Hollie Thomas (Otago University) & Coach/Manager Rod Bannister (Otago) not only competed but came a close third (points count-back) to BOP. Congratulations also goes to Aria in winning the girl's New Zealand U15 title. To round off a very successful year for our juniors, congratulations to Martha Toghill who has been selected for the New Zealand Junior Girls' Team travelling to Australia later in December to compete in the Trans-Tasman Series.

After the disappointment of having 'C' Grade National Super Champs cancelled in 2021, Brent Taucher and the Alexandra Squash Club, organized and hosted a very successful National 'E' Grade Event ably assisted by neighboring clubs Omakau and Cromwell. Overall team winners were Henderson Squash Club Women from Auckland and Hastings Tennis & Squash Club in the Men.

A much depleted Otago Master's Team more aptly called 'Otakato' travelled to Hamilton in September to contest both the teams and individual competitions. Due to late pull-outs for various reasons, we were grateful to Fran Hopkins and Nicki Blake for their help in organising a number of local Waikato players to plug the holes. Thank you also to Alby King (Pirates) for managing the team.

The usual Central Otago & Dunedin interclub competitions successfully concluded without delays with a new entrant to the Dunedin competition - Oamaru Squash Club taking out the Mixed 'A' Division using Palmerston as their home courts. Numbers for pre and post-Christmas summer tourney competitions were slightly down on previous years but the experiment of providing women's only draws had its supporters which will probably be trialed again in February giving the lower graded women a choice of format. Information on Central Otago's interclub and tournaments can be viewed later in the report (refer page 15).

2022 Champion of Champions, which hasn't been supported greatly in the past did have interest in most grades this year, thanks to the push by Hamish Dudley (Otago University) hosting the local eliminations together with the Nationals being hosted by neighbours Southland. Congratulations to Lowri Waugh (Otago University) in winning the Women's 'A' Grade – our only successor.

Moving away from events and onto what keeps our sport viable. I cannot emphasis enough the importance of our Clubs and their administrations who continually work tirelessly in the background improving their facilities, providing in-house competitions, coaching and offering encouragement to their memberships and in short keeps our sport out in the public domain, accessible to not just club members but to the community as a whole. Now days, membership is not always a criteria for involvement and with new directions being taken within the sport, this is going to be more the case. Hopefully, clubs have been keeping up with the circulated correspondence advising of the forthcoming changes in all areas of our sport.

Another area of extreme importance to our sport is our funders and sponsors who have supported us over many years. The Otago Community Trust, our major supporter has once again continued their support in the 2022 year for which we are so very grateful and would struggle without. The Lion Foundation and Bendigo Valley Sports & Charity Foundation also came up trumps and we were successful in getting a couple of funding rounds of Government Wage Subside which obviously will not happen again. Squash Otago warmly recognizes the support received from our loyal sponsors without whose tangible assistance, the sport would be significantly less successful – (refer page 12).

A special mention of the Otago University Squash Club and the students who have worked valiantly to wield off being kicked out of their club by the Otago University. Alas, the 31st December is D-Day with no exceptions. Arrangements have been made with the Otago Squash Club for their club to operate out of their Kaikorai Valley Road clubrooms in 2023 as a temporary measure in hope of Tennis Otago agreeing to rehouse them at the Logan Park courts. The student club is such a very proud and important part of the Dunedin squash scene, with a long history of great young squash players who certainly knew how to play on and off the court. While the club is still operating, there is always hope of a solution being found!!

My congratulations and thanks to all squash players, teams, administrators, referees, coaches and parents for being part of and helping out with our great sport. Congratulations to the Pirates Squash Club in winning the Dunedin 'Top Club' Shield and best wishes for a successful result with their nomination for the National Top Club Award. Best wishes also goes to Pirates Ben Edwards (Coaching) and Amy Coleman (Volunteer) for their respective nominations in SNZ National Awards.

To the Dunedin Games Committee (names on page 12) and Helen Brownlie (Chair) my thanks for your time and effort for another season well organized. Special thanks to the Otago Squash Club for hosting a very successful Dunedin interclub prize-giving, themed 'Favourite Sports'. To Brent Taucher, Paul Johnson and their Central Otago team for organizing and overseeing your competitions, a big vote of thanks.

To Stuart Hammer (Board & Life Member) and Ken Rewcastle (Auditor) who resigned earlier in the year, a huge thank you for your expert advice, guidance and friendship over all of my tenure – you are certainly missed. Finally to the 2022 Board, my special thanks for your continued help and support.

My best wishes for a safe and happy Christmas and New Year with your family and friends. I think you all deserve it. See you in 2023.

The move to New Zealand's new COVID-19 traffic light system in December 2021 once again created some uncertainty about whether competitive squash could proceed under the new regulations. And then the South Island moved to Red from 23 January to 13 April!! Yes, the 2022 interclub competition could proceed and yes, it commenced as planned and on schedule.

The 2022 Dunedin Interclub Competition consisted of sixty-two mixed teams competing on either the Tuesday or Wednesday night. This included the Oamaru A team playing in Division One, using Palmerston as their home courts. After all the changes several years ago, the format for the Competition is now well established, and once again the Competition was both very competitive and enjoyable across all the grades. The continued use of the iSquash Interclub module and the distribution of information via posters, email and the Squash Otago website all contributed to the success of the Competition.





The 2022 Otago District Junior Open was played in conjunction with the 6th and final tournament of the HEAD Junior Series hosted by Pirates Squash Club on 20th & 21st August. Both Girl's & Boy's titles were won convincingly by top seeds Aria Bannister and Ashton Hansen (Otago SC). Neither dropped a match in their way to taking out the championships. Nine year old, Levi Casey (Cromwell) who is holding an impressive D1 grading, is a name of the future. As well as winning the 2022 Junior Personality Cup, Levi won the Boy's 'A' grade from much older Kyan Prince of Wanaka; Boys 'B' went to Liam Brady from Taieri from club mate Max Cross with Jaxon Innes (Taieri) winning the Boy's 'C' over Sam Pool also from Taieri. There was more interest in Men's 'C' Grade which was played at the Otago University courts with the students coming out victors over Sunnyvale 3 – 2 and over Alexandra 4 – 1. A keen Sunnyvale team was a strong second place-getter with a 3 – 2 match win over Alexandra.

Pirates were the only entrants in the men's & women's 'D' Grade with the Pirates ladies heading to Kawaroa Park to check out the strength of 'D' graders from around the country.

With 'E' Grade Nationals being hosted by Alexandra, there was a good turn out for eliminations which with local teams playing on Friday night and then the rest played at Pirates on Saturday. Men's team from Alexandra (2); Omakau, Wanaka, Otago & Pirates took part while women's from Pirates, Alexandra and Cromwell battled it out in Cromwell. Winners were Men's Alexandra 'A' & Cromwell Women. To make for a balanced draw and after a few team pull outs, there was a good representative from Central Otago clubs with runner-ups Omakau also taking part.



2022 Central Otago Squash Report

A good attendance in person and on-line was reported at the meeting and finale to end off the 2022 CO squash season.

<u>Top Club</u> - It was agreed that the Top Club competition was not working for most clubs suggesting that clubs put on their 'thinking caps' over the summer break to come up with a new formula to bring to the first meeting of the new year. Decisions agreed upon - it would start early April and run for approximately 5 - 6 weeks with possibly an E/F super series to encourage lower graded players to take part.

<u>Interclub</u> - Interclub review was more positive with most clubs happy with the format. Premier & Division one worked very well but Division 2 had quite a few uneven matches. Agreed that point range needs to be tightened and also another division (3) needed to be created. Using a blue dot ball for all 'E' Grade competition and below was discussed. Finally, it was requested that at least two more people should review and format teams at the start of the competition.
